The image on this ad from National Right to Life is an unaltered ultrasound of an actual child taken using General Electric Corporation's new 4D-ultrasound system. GE recently aired a commercial depicting a married couple viewing a 4-D image of their unborn child, with background music "The First Time Ever I Saw Your Face."

In the commercial, the parents are visibly moved by the clear image of their unborn baby. The commercial ends with the couple holding their newborn child, which greatly resembles that in the ultrasound.

GE's 4-D ultrasound technology has entranced America and cheered the pro-life community and others, with its open window into the womb. Though the technology is currently too expensive for most non-profit pregnancy care centers to obtain, some shopping malls have or are planning non-medical kiosks where women can have 4-D ultrasounds of their unborn children taken for photo packets for friends and relatives.

We do not know GE's motivation in producing this technology. Regardless, the miracle it reveals is priceless.

Haskell Facility Still Open

Chief U.S. District Judge Walter H. Rice has ordered an extension that temporarily restrains the Ohio Department of Health from closing Martin Haskell's abortion facility in Kettering, Ohio. Health Department director, Dr. J. Nick Baird, has sought closure because Haskell has not obtained a state-required transfer agreement with a local hospital.

A transfer agreement ensures availability of a hospital that will admit women who suffer abortion-related complications. Haskell has been fighting the requirement, with his attorneys claiming it places too great a burden on women seeking abortions in Ohio. Baird's attorneys say that the requirement ensures patients immediate access to any needed care. A hearing is scheduled for early June in Columbus on the restraining order and the merits of Haskell's complaint.

Cultural Differences...or Honesty?

During a vacation in Japan, my daughter and my grandson noticed something they had never seen before, and which they could not explain. They were rows of mizuko jizos—small statues of babies, dressed in bibs and knitted caps. Next to the statues were bottles of milk and baby toys.



Mizuko jizos are made or bought by abortive parents. Rows of the statues can be found in cemeteries and temples where they are housed to commemorate children who have died. It is said that parents pay hundreds of dollars a year to have their statues bathed and dressed, and incense burned and prayers offered.

One survey indicated 86% Japanese women and 76% men said they would feel guilty having an abortion. Contrast this with a statement in the U.S. press when abortion became legal: "Fifteen minutes to feel like a brand new woman." (*Omaha World-Herald*)

The *San Francisco Chronicle* told how a typical young woman "came back from the abortion smiling" and told her patiently waiting mother, "I'm starved. Let's go to lunch." But the stark mourning of Japanese abortive parents indicates too much guilt to be ignored.

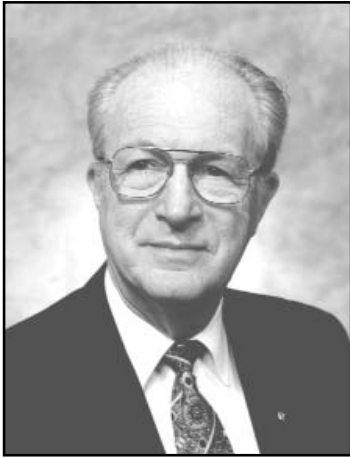

PROTESTORS VINDICATED: The Supreme Court ruled February 16, 2003 that a federal racketeering law used to punish pro-life protestors was used improperly. The court ruled 8-1, removing injunctions established nationwide against pro-

life protestors under *Scheidler vs. National Organization for Women and Operation Rescue vs. National Organization for Women*. This is a success for Joe Scheidler, Operation Rescue, and other pro-life protestors who had been ordered to pay damages to abortion clinics and stay away from the businesses for ten years. Support for this ruling was encouraged by other groups that conduct protests, not all of them pro-life. Justice John Paul Stevens was the only dissenter.

DOLLY THE SHEEP DIES: Dolly the sheep, the first cloned mammal in the history of the world, was born in 1996. Initially she seemed healthy and has given birth to six lambs. When she was five years old, however, she developed premature arthritis. Now at age six, she has been euthanized due to progressive lung disease. Sheep normally live 11 or 12 years. Lung disease is common in older sheep. Clearly, Dolly was not an entirely normal animal, and this reflects directly back to the fact that she was cloned. We are being told by scientists that no cloned animal will ever be normal. Dolly and her history certainly support this prediction.

U.S. HOUSE BANS ALL HUMAN CLONING: On February 12, 2003, in a 19 to 12 vote, the Judiciary Committee of the U.S. House of Representatives approved the Weldon-Stupak Human Cloning Prohibition Act (HR534) to prohibit the creation of human embryos by cloning in the United States. This bill is nearly identical to last year's legislation, which passed the House by a vote of 265 to 162. Sadly, in the last session, Senator Daschle bottled up the bill and did not give the Senate a chance to vote on it.

ROTARY RENEWS PRO-ABORTION COMMITMENT: Rotary International and the strongly pro-abortion UN Population Fund have renewed their commitment to work together on population and

development issues worldwide. A February 5, 2003 UNFPA press release welcomed the renewal of this "memorandum of cooperation," stating, "We cannot confront the massive challenges of poverty, hunger, disease and environmental destruction unless we address issues of population and *reproductive health*" (italics added). This is tragic. Rotary International has been providing humanitarian service in 160 countries through 30,000 Rotary clubs for years. Now they are turning to compulsory abortion and sterilization in cooperation with the aggressively pro-abortion UNFPA.

STEM CELL COMPANY FLOUNDERING: The Geron Corporation in San Jose, California is a major player in human embryonic stem cell research. We have noted in the past that this research is not attracting venture capital, while adult stem cell research is receiving very adequate support from financial investors. Geron was forced to layoff one-third of its staff and cut research spending last summer. In January, it announced that another 40 researchers and support staff were being laid off. This leaves the company with only 51 employees. Its stock has lost two-thirds of its value in the market over the last year. It never did make money, and raising new money now has proven problematic, according to its chief financial officer, David Greenwood. Pro-life people support adult stem cell research as more ethical, and in all probability, more universally useful. Now it seems that the judgment of the financial market supports this.

BLATANT MEDIA BIAS: Let's set the record straight. Organizers of the January 22nd pro-life March for Life in Washington have agreed that the two largest marches were those for the 25th anniversary five years ago, and the 30th anniversary this year. Nellie Gray, the chief organizer, stated that the march five years ago exceeded 100,000 and that this year's was substantially larger. Yet news commentator, Dan Rather, made this statement: "Tens of thousands of demonstrators on both sides of the issue filled the streets of Washington today." Both sides? There were tens of thousands of pro-lifers, but only a few "tens" at the pro-abortion rallies.

MORE KILLING: Planned Parenthood of Minnesota and South Dakota has sued the State of South Dakota over a state law that prohibits mid- and

late-term (dilation and extraction or D&E) abortions performed anywhere but in a sanitary and well-equipped hospital. This type of abortion is the method used on unborn babies three-and-a-half or four months in development. At this age and beyond, the baby is eight to 12 inches long and can weigh a half to two pounds. D&E essentially involves live dismemberment resulting in death. South Dakota law currently mandates D&Es can only be done in an approved, clean, regulated, safe hospital by licensed physicians. Planned Parenthood wants this dangerous procedure available from freestanding abortion facilities. Since Planned Parenthood facilities kill every tenth child destroyed in abortion in the United States, perhaps we should not be surprised.

UN ADMITS POPULATION BUST: A recently released United Nations report finally admits what pro-life sources and informed demographers have long been predicting: “All the evidence suggests fertility is falling rapidly in developing countries with no sign that it’s going to stop at the magical number of two.” The replacement rate is 2.1 babies per woman in her lifetime. The UN report now warns that the average fertility rate will drop to 1.5 by mid-century, which means that the world population will then begin to decline. For example, the fertility rate in Thailand, which was 5.0 in the 1970s, has dropped to under two. In Iran, the rate has gone from 6.5 to 2.75. With two or three minor exceptions, all of Western Europe now has fertility rates ranging from 1.2 to about 1.8. The West is dying, and it looks now as though the underdeveloped world will follow some decades later.

CHABOT INTRODUCES PARTIAL-BIRTH BAN: February 13, 2003, Congressman Steve Chabot (R-Cincinnati), chairman of the House Subcommittee on The Constitution, introduced a bill to ban partial-birth abortions. This bill is almost identical to the bill in the last session of Congress, which passed the House by vote of 274 to 151. Despite this overwhelming support, Senator Daschle pigeonholed the bill in the Senate and did not allow it to be brought to a vote. President Bush, in his recent State of the Union Address, stated, “We must not overlook the weakest among us. I ask you to protect infants at the very hour of their birth and end the practice of partial-birth abortion.” We note also that this highly controversial procedure has been denounced by almost everyone, including the American Medical Association which stated that it “is not an accepted medical practice...”

SACRAMENTO BISHOP LECTURES GOVERNOR GRAY DAVIS: Governor Gray Davis of California has been aggressively pro-abortion, yet claims to be an active Catholic. In late January, the Catholic bishop of Sacramento, William Weigand, addressed this paradox, “As your bishop, I have to say clearly that anyone—politician or otherwise—who thinks it is acceptable for a Catholic to be pro-abortion is in very great error, puts his or her soul at risk and is not in good standing with the Church.” Bishop Weigand counseled Davis and any other Catholic abortion advocate to “abstain from receiving Holy Communion until he has a change of heart.” The governor’s defenders chided Bishop Weigand for “telling the faithful how to practice their faith.” (Isn’t that what bishops are for?) Then the governor’s office argued, “There are a lot of Catholics who are pro-choice. Does the bishop want all these Catholics to stop receiving Holy Communion? Who’s going to be left in church?” We might recall St. Paul’s words in I Corinthians 11, that “those who receive communion unworthily drink judgment upon themselves.” Presumably those left in the church will be faithful Catholics.

DEADLY DOZEN? An ad has been recently released listing the “Deadly Dozen,” elected Catholics who are pro-abortion. They included Sen. Ted Kennedy (D-MA), Sen. Tom Harkin (D-IA), Sen. John Kerry (D-MA), Sen. Tom Daschle (D-SD), Sen. Christopher Dodd (D-CT), Sen. Susan Collins (R-ME), Sen. Jack Reed (D-RI), Sen. Patty Murray (D-WA), Sen. Mary Landrieu (D-LA), Sen. Patrick Leahy (D-VT), Sen. Barbara Mikulski (D-MD) and Sen. Joseph Biden (D-DE). Looks like there are about twelve more bishops who might heed Bishop Weigand’s example.

STEM CELL RESEARCH REPLACING CLONING: Alan Trounson, Australian embryonic stem cell expert, has stated that adult stem cell research has advanced so rapidly in the past few months that research cloning is now unnecessary. He states, “My view is that there are at least three or four other alternatives that are more attractive already.” The following studies vindicating the above have been published within the past year:

KENTUCKY SENATE PASSES FETAL HOMICIDE BILL: On February 11, the Kentucky Senate passed a fetal homicide bill by a vote of 34 to 3. This law declared that human life begins at conception and provides penalties for deliberate assault actions that kill a pre-born baby.

USA TRENDING MORE PRO-LIFE: A USA Today CNN Gallup poll of one thousand adults yielded the following results:

- ♦ 88% support laws requiring doctors to inform patients of alternatives to abortion.
- ♦ 78% support a 24-hour waiting period before a woman can undergo an abortion.
- ♦ 73% support parental notification laws for women under age 18.
- ♦ 72% support laws requiring women to notify their husbands if they are going to have an abortion.
- ♦ 70% support banning partial-birth abortion, except to save a woman's life.
- ♦ 38% favor a Constitutional amendment forbidding all abortions, except to save a woman's life.

THE POPE ABORTED? A new book entitled, *Fatima: The Story Behind the Miracles*, states that the Pope's mother, Emilia Wojtyla, was advised in 1920 to abort her unborn child—the child who would even-

tually become Pope John Paul II. Her health was frail, and after her first child doctors told her not to have any more. She did become pregnant. Abortion was advised. She refused. According to the book, during this pregnancy, "her weakened body was tested almost beyond endurance." (*The Interim*, May 2002)

MEDICAL STUDENTS FOR CHOICE: Medical Students for Choice now has chapters on 100 medical school campuses. We do not know the size, influence, membership and strength of these chapters, but their existence is not good news, as one of our goals is to continue to reduce the number of doctors who will do abortions. Without doctors there would be no abortions. The good news is that there is a small but growing Physicians Life Alliance, which has helped to begin Medical Students for Life. Since students come to school, then graduate and leave, it is important to have a base support group like this that remains in existence over the years. The alliance is currently working with student groups on 18 medical school campuses. The only chapter in Ohio is at Ohio University's College of Medicine. We are not aware of any chapters chartered in Kentucky or Indiana. For information and help setting up a group, contact Physicians Life Alliance, P.O. INEFFECTIVE PREVENTION: It has been widely assumed that a commonly used contraceptive gel "protects" women from pregnancy and also sexually transmitted diseases. Pregnancy aside, the Federal Food and Drug Administration has officially warned that contraceptives using Nonoxynol-9 are not effective in preventing HIV infection. The FDA states that while Nonoxynol-9 damages the cell walls of some sexually transmitted disease organisms and thus inhibits their use, it also has a membrane damaging effect on the cells lining the vagina and cervix, which possibly increases the risk of sexually transmitted and HIV diseases.

PLANNED PARENTHOOD LINK REMOVED: In the February issue we reported on several Catholic Universities promoting Planned Parenthood from their web sites. We are pleased to report that due to efforts of John Carroll University's Students for Life, their link to Planned Parenthood has been removed. Students are now directed to pregnancy support services.

An Agenda for Children

Planned Parenthood's www.teenwire.com web site has successfully targeted a youth audience with its goal to provide a confidential place where teens can obtain their information about sex, relationships, and lifestyles. According to Life Decisions International, the site receives nearly 360,000 visits per month. We strongly urge adults to check this site out, along with Planned Parenthood's Reality-Based Education and Learning for Life (R.E.A.L.) Kit (www.plannedparenthood.org/education/advocacy.html), which includes 17 documents prepared for adults to advocate Planned Parenthood's idea of responsible sexuality education. All the documents are available online.

Sugar Coating Evil

Stonewater, a book by Barbara Snow Gilbert written for 13 year olds and up, is a novel about a dying grandfather's last wish and his request of his grandson Grant to fulfill it. Grandpa's wish is assisted suicide. The Children's Book Council's vague review states, "Engaging and intelligent, Grant's story examines and illuminates the moral, ethical, and legal implications of an increasingly prominent and controversial human issue." (www.cbcbooks.org/html/stonewater.html) Here, from the book, is Grant's supposedly engaging and intelligent decision: "Grant rejected all the labels. For him, 'it' was three simple words nobody had to look up: 'it' was helping Grandpa die." (*Stonewater*, Laurel-Leaf, p. 61)

Someone Finally Noticed

A video that has been running at the Lincoln Memorial in Washington for eight years is now under review by the National Park Service after the whistle has been blown on implications in the film that President Lincoln would have supported abortion and homosexual rights. The video is part of a student-oriented exhibit sponsored by the

Close Up Foundation, which upon confrontation denied having anything to do with its content. It was produced by award-winning National Park Service filmmaker, Tim Radford. The video is shown in the Lincoln Legacy Room as part of an exhibit conceived of and partially financed by students to show how Lincoln's legacy influenced the modern civil rights movement.

Another Life Wonder

The Journal of the American Medical Association recently documented a study's findings that premature babies born with brain-damage may improve in intelligence over time. A study of 296 children, born at 28 weeks and weighing just over two pounds, indicates that common preemie neurological problems—such as cerebral palsy, retardation, vision trouble, and learning and behavior troubles—are much resolved for many by age eight. The children were tested with IQ tests beginning at age three, and point improvement was documented over time bringing them into the 90-95 score range, with 100 considered average for an eight year old of normal birth weight.

Go Figure

The population rate is falling fast in Russia. So fast that the government is offering mothers a free home if they agree to have three babies. To receive this benefit a woman just has to prove that she is fertile, her husband is not an alcoholic, and agree that she will bear her children within five years. One predication indicates that at current rates, the Russian population could fall from 143 million to 90 million by 2050. And the problem is not enough babies. Some say the high poverty level limits child-bearing because children are expensive. However, abortion is the primary method of birth control in Russia, with Russia's abortion rate one of the highest worldwide. It is esti-

ated that there are approximately 200 abortions for every 100 births.

Ignoring the Evidence

Despite overwhelming medical evidence confirming the link between abortion and breast cancer, a report issued after a recent National Cancer Institute conference says no such link exists. Pro-life researchers and women say that those who produced the report relied almost solely on a defective study of Danish medical records. The NCI also did not invite Janet Dahling of the Fred Hutchinson Cancer Center in Seattle to present a paper, even though Dahling was chief researcher for an NCI-funded study that found a strong relationship between breast cancer and abortion. Pro-life advocates suspect that the NCI is more anxious to avoid a politically sensitive issue rather than protect women's health. 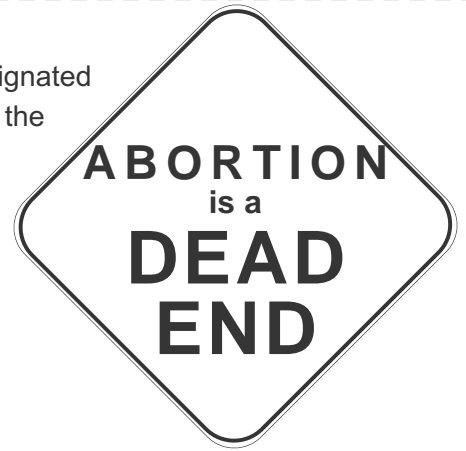
