Prayer Walk Celebrated Life

Each of the seven Sundays in Lent several hundred people spent the afternoon participating in a prayer walk around abortionist Martin Haskell's abortion



facility, the Women's Med Center on Jefferson Ave. Area high schools and other organizations were represented on different Sundays, with all available participants coming together for the final walk on Palm Sunday.

Palm Sunday's vigil included a Jericho march encircling the abortion center seven times, with participants holding palm branches brought from their churches to add to the celebration of life. The celebration cul-

Cincinnati Resolution Supports Ban

Wednesday, March 19, 2003, Cincinnati City Council passed city Res. No. 0033-2003, which lends support for Congressman Steve Chabot's federal partial birth abortion ban legislation. Councilman Chris Monzel sponsored the resolution, ensuring that Cincinnati has a documented position on this legislation currently in the nation's spotlight.

The resolution passed 5-4 on a second round of voting for a revised resolution, which did not include references to the partial birth abortion procedure's developer, Martin Haskell, who operates the Women's Med Center on Jefferson Ave. in Cincinnati. Voting for the resolution were Paul Booth, John Cranley, Pat DeWine, Chris Monzel, and James Tarbell; against, Minette Cooper, David Crowley, David Pepper, and Alicia Reece.

Preliminary statements for the resolution were limited to a representative each from seven Cincinnati pro-life organizations, including Right to Life of Greater Cincinnati. A statement against was presented by Cincinnati attorney, Alphonse Gerhardstein.

Because of the city's association with Haskell, Cincinnati had the unique opportunity and responsibility to show support for a ban on partial birth abortion. City Council members who voted in favor of this resolution demonstrated positive leadership in their recognition of the seriousness of violent destruction of a late-term developed child up until the moment of birth.

KUDOS TO CHABOT, DEWINE, AND VOINOVICH: Cincinnati, Ohio and the entire pro-life movement in the United States have reason to be immensely proud of Cincinnati's Congressman Steve

Chabot and Ohio Senators Mike DeWine and George Voinovich. Chabot authored the partial birth abortion ban legislation that was recently passed in the Senate. He is leading the charge for its passage in the U.S. House. Senators Mike DeWine and George Voinovich, along with Senator Rick Santorum (R-PA) and others, introduced the bill in the Senate. DeWine and Voinovich eloquently defended the pro-life ethic on the floor of the Senate, demolishing arguments for amendments that would have gutted the ban. FIRST DOLLY, NOW MATILDA: Dolly was the first cloned sheep to survive, the only one of 277 tries. She developed progressive premature arthritis, other signs of premature aging, and then progressive lung disease—all common in a sheep nearing the end of an average 11 to 12 year life span. But Dolly was only six when she was euthanized for these incurable illnesses. Matilda was Australia's first cloned sheep, who was younger than Dolly. One week after Dolly's death, Matilda died suddenly on February 19. Premature sudden death has frequently been reported for cloned mammals. The technique used to create both of these sheep is exactly the same technique being proposed for human cloning—both "research" cloning, sometimes called "clone and kill," and "reproductive" cloning, which would bring a cloned human to term and birth.

CEREBRAL PALSY NOT CAUSED BY CHILD-BIRTH: The American College of Obstetricians and Gynecologists and the American Academy of

Pediatrics have released a well-documented report indicating that less than 10% cerebral palsy cases are caused by lack of oxygen to an infant's brain during labor and delivery. It found that most children with cerebral palsy experienced "pre-natal problems" such as, "infection in the pregnant woman, clotting disorders and strokes that could damage brains long before labor begins." According to this report, most cerebral palsy cases are completely unpreventable and have nothing to do with good practice or malpractice by the obstetrician during labor and delivery. Suing obstetricians for alleged malpractice during labor and delivery resulting in cerebral palsy has been lucrative for trial lawyers. It will be interesting to see the effect of this prestigious report, which vindicates what most Ob-Gyn specialists have known all along. (*New York Times*, 2-26-03)

ULTRASOUND BILL IN CONGRESS: A bill has been introduced in the U.S. House to partially fund the purchase of ultrasound machines for pregnancy help centers. The bill would appropriate \$3 million, which would provide up to half of the cost of ultrasound equipment. This money would go only to non-profit centers that do not charge for services. This would benefit the average pregnancy help center and totally exclude abortion facilities because all of them charge for services, though many of them are technically non-profit. The sponsor of the bill is Rep. Cliff Stearns (R-FL).

COLLEGES INFLUENCE STUDENTS ON ABORTION: A UCLA survey of 38 of the nation's 200 Catholic colleges has been published. It reports that in all four years of undergraduate school, Catholic students at Catholic colleges are more pro-life than those in non-sectarian schools. However, 38% Catholic freshmen at these colleges thought abortion should be legal, but by their senior year 52% were pro-abortion. The pro-abortion percentages at non-sectarian schools were 50% going in and 65% as seniors. The Cardinal Newman Society, which is dedicated to reinforcing the religious identity of Catholic colleges, criticized the survey. The Society stated that

the schools selected for this survey were primarily liberal Catholic colleges that hardly deserve the name Catholic anymore. The director of the UCLA Institute, William Korn, agreed saying, "If all Catholic colleges had been surveyed, the changes observed would probably be less." On the positive side, the changes were not all negative. Eight percent of Catholics who went to non-sectarian colleges and 16% of those at Catholic colleges said that they graduated with "much stronger religious beliefs and convictions" than they had as entering freshmen.

VAGINA MONOLOGUES AT XU: Three showings of a student production of the *Vagina Monologues* was scheduled for Xavier University in March. Eight days before the performances word leaked out, including information from the official *Vagina Monologues* web site (www.vaginamonologues.com). The web site extols this dramatic production and lists the titles of the seventeen monologues, most which cannot be printed in this newsletter. Some tamer examples are, "If Your Vagina Got Dressed, What Would It Wear?" "My Angry Vagina," "My Vagina Was My Village." Funds from the production are to go to an agency that helps prevent violence towards women, even though focus on women's bodies and sexuality is demeaning to women and is known to cause such violence.

This play has no place on a Catholic campus. A few days before the scheduled performances, university president, Father Mike Graham, investigated and then cancelled the shows, generating an outpouring of gratitude from those supporting a decision of integrity. However, a tenured professor announced that she would use her academic freedom to present the monologues in her class. She was then permitted to conduct this "class" in the student center auditorium, where the *Vagina Monologues* were shown several times.

Planned Parenthood is a primary advocate for this show, encouraging an annual V-Day on campuses across the nation. This year Planned Parenthood included in its support the targeting of religiously affiliated hospitals that do not provide emergency contraception to sexual assault victims (see www.plannedparenthood.org/vox/vday.html).

The *Vagina Monologues* have also been presented on other Catholic university campuses in the country.

ASSAULT RAPE PREGNANCY? Planned Parenthood president, Gloria Feldt, has stated, "Of the hundreds of thousands of women who are raped or sexually assaulted in the U.S. each year, it is estimated that 32,000 become pregnant." Yet firm statistics show that in the entire United States in one year no more than 500 women become pregnant from assault rape. Another claim is that, "The morning-after pill, taken within 72 hours of unprotected sex, can reduce the risk of pregnancy by as much as 89%." Yet the fact is that the overwhelming majority of times the pill is taken it isn't needed because the woman is not fertile during that particular encounter. But if fertilization has occurred, the great majority of times the pill prevents implantation of the human embryo, which then dies. For a small percentage, the pill might prevent fertilization of an ovum that may be released some days after the event. This could be a small percentage, but no more than that.

KUCINICH FOR PRESIDENT: Cleveland, Ohio Congressman Dennis Kucinich has announced that he will throw his hat in the ring for the Democrat nomination for the presidency. In his previous political careers, as mayor of Cleveland and most recently as a congressman, he has been pro-life. In 1996, for instance, when running for the U.S. House, he said, "I believe that life begins at conception." Now that he's running on the Democrat ticket, Kucinich has changed his position 180 degrees, stating, "As president, I would protect abortion and would make sure that appointees to the Supreme Court protect that right."

CATHOLIC POSITION REMAINS FIRM: The Roman Catholic Church has insisted that Catholic politicians "have a grave and clear obligation to oppose any law that attacks human life." This unambiguous teaching was documented in an 18-page "Doctrinal Note on Some Questions Regarding the Participation of Catholics in Political Life," prepared by the Congregation for the Doctrine of the Faith and issued by the Vatican on January 1, 2003. The document, approved by Pope John Paul II, observes that "a kind of cultural relativism exists today, evident in the conceptualization and defense of an ethical pluralism," but affirms that Catholic legislators "cannot

compromise" on a "correct understanding of the human person" and must "defend the basic right of life from conception to natural death." In so doing, they must also "recall the duty to respect and protect the rights of the embryo." The document states that for legislators, as for every Catholic, it is impossible to promote laws which attack human life, or to vote for them. However, an elected official may licitly support proposals aimed at limiting the harm done by a permissive abortion law when "it is not possible to overturn or completely repeal a law allowing abortion which is already in force or coming up for a vote." PRO-LIFE FEMINIST LEGACY CONTINUES:

Susan B. Anthony is known as the first feminist in American history. Unlike today's radical feminists, Anthony called abortion "child murder," and wrote, "No matter what the reason, if love of ease, or desire to save from suffering the unborn innocent, a woman is awfully guilty who commits the deed. It will burden her conscience in life. It will burden her soul in death. But, oh, thrice guilty is he who drove her to the desperation which impelled her to the crime." Anthony considered abortion a form of oppression and a burden to women. For her, full equality for women meant the elimination of abortion.

Today, an organization called the Susan B. Anthony List works to elect pro-life women to the U.S. Congress. Jane Abraham, president of the Susan B. Anthony List, states, "We are proud to continue our namesake's pro-life legacy by supporting pro-life women running for public office. Susan B. Anthony was a champion for the dignity and rights for all. This position was seamless. She felt strongly that unborn children should be protected. This was a truly pro-woman position."

Another up and coming organization that also follows the tradition of Susan B. Anthony is the actively pro-life Feminists for Life (www.feministsforlife.org).

SELECTIVE POPULATION CONTROL: Planned Parenthood founder, Margaret Sanger, stated the following in her *Birth Control Review* of October 1926:

"There is only one reply to a request for a higher birthrate among the intelligent, and that is to ask the government to first take the burden of the insane and feeble minded from your back. [Mandatory] Sterilization for these is the answer."

CONGENITAL PROBLEMS WITH IVF: In Vitro Fertilization has become a very common procedure worldwide. Enough babies have now been born via this process that some studies have been done on large groups. The findings are somewhat disturbing, because it seems there are more problems with these babies than those conceived and born naturally. A study from The Netherlands shows that the risk of retinoblastoma, a malignant tumor in the eye, is up to seven times greater among children conceived by IVF. In Britain, researchers have found a greater risk of Beckwith-Wiedemann Syndrome (birth defects and childhood cancer). In addition to these structural problems, functional problems have been identified. IVF babies are twice as likely to need neurological therapy, with the most common diagnosis being cerebral palsy (3.7 times more common). The second most common neurological problem, developmental delay, was increased four-fold in IVF children. No causative reasons for these problems were suggested.

"WOMEN'S RIGHT TO KNOW" NOW LAW IN WV: West Virginia now has a women's right-to-know law that requires an abortionist to offer women printed materials regarding abortion risks and procedures plus fetal development "in person, by mail or over the Internet." And it requires the abortionist to tell her the estimated gestational age of her baby. The law permits women seeking abortions to file suit against doctors who do not provide the required information before the abortion. It also requires abortionists to file several reports with the state health department. West Virginia's pro-abortion governor, Bob Rise (D), opposed the bill but allowed it to become law without his signature.

Normalizing Suicide

Oregon has the infamous reputation as the first and currently only state to legalize assisted suicide via lethal medication. The original reason for this legislation was to give people an option when facing great pain before death or terminal illness, i.e., a presumed way to die with dignity. Thirty-eight people ended their lives under this law in 2002. However, 84% of those who did stated that they most feared loss of autonomy, inability to participate in enjoyable activities, and loss of bodily functions—not the desire to diminish pain and suffering. In the five years since assisted suicide was legalized in Oregon, sixteen people died in 1998, 27 in both 1999 and 2000, 21 in 2001, and 38 last year. U.S. Attorney General John Ashcroft is challenging this law before the 9th U.S. Circuit Court of Appeals, with a decision expected this summer. Oregon's law and the court's subsequent determination will influence how other states handle this life issue.

Life Issues Degrees

Master's Divinity University in Evansville, IN now offers a Life-Issues Counseling university degree program. To earn the degree, students choose a degree in either practical ministry or biblical studies, with a major in life issues counseling. Courses cover biblically based approaches to post-abortion counseling, bioethics, abortion, death and grief, and more. More information is available from www.mdivs.edu/lifeissuescounseling.html. Pro-Life Investing

The Timothy Plan is a mutual fund that offers pro-life investors a way to avoid

investing in companies that could be supporting the abortion industry as well as other questionable practices. Its web site states: "The Timothy Plan avoids investing in companies that are involved in practices contrary to Judeo-Christian principles. Our goal is to recapture traditional American values. We are America's first pro-life, pro-family, biblically-based mutual fund group." Additional information, as well as a downloadable prospectus is available from this site. What Price Vanity?

Oral contraceptives are being prescribed to treat teen acne. However, disturbing statistics from some studies indicate a link between the pill and breast cancer, with a much greater risk for a woman who has taken the pill for four or more years before the birth of her first child. One of several information sources is the book, *Breast Cancer: Its Link to Abortion and the Birth Control Pill* by Dr. Chris Kahlenborn (available from www.omsoul.com). Another wrinkle is that though contraceptives might be prescribed for non-sexual reasons, young women might be subtly encouraged to be sexually active or preyed upon by those who know they are "protected."

Truth for Teens

Black Friday is the fourth novel in a new Soul Survivor fiction series for teens, written by ultra-successful Left Behind series author, Tim LaHaye, and youth culture specialist, Bob DeMoss. The book presents the truth regarding the abortion industry in a fictional setting for readers who are in the age group for teen pregnancies and crisis choices. All books in the series have received high praise.

Seeing the Light

Despite earlier agendas otherwise, both the American Cancer Society and the American Heart Association have dis-

tanced themselves from embryonic stem cell research. This is another example of the trend for private institutions to move away from such research toward adult stem cell research, which is yielding positive results. More Positive Turnabout

The Walt Disney Company and American Express are now off Life Decisions International's boycott list for companies that contribute to Planned Parenthood. Credit for these companies' positive funding decisions is credited in part to the tenacity of those who would not give up on possible change.

A baby shower campaign is a great way for schools, churches, businesses, and other organizations to raise funds or collect needed supplies and equipment for area pregnancy care centers.
