A capacity crowd of 600 joined our Honorary Chairs Anne and Bill Burleigh and this year's Life Award recipients Mary and John McCormick for this inspirational dinner held at the Sharonville Convention Center.

WCPO TV News Anchor Brian Patrick served as the Emcee for the evening and opened the event by leading us in singing "God Bless America." The banquet program included Rev. Myra Ary of the Sharonville United Methodist Church, Father John Putka of the University of Dayton, and Jaimie Yoho, a young singer with the teen ministry Mishpachah. Our keynote speaker was David C. Reardon, Ph.D., a bio-medical ethicist whose work focuses on the aftereffects of abortion on women.

The weekend for life continued on Saturday with an Expo and Seminar. The Respect Life Expo showcased the work of a number of area respect for life organizations: pregnancy help centers, maternity homes, adoption agencies, etc. This free event focused on families and included entertainment, door

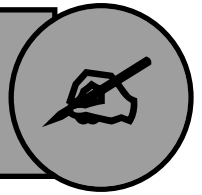

DR. WILLKE WRITES



VICTORY FOR FREEDOM OF SPEECH: In September, the Fourth Circuit U.S. Court of Appeals affirmed a lower court decision striking down a federal election commission regulation. It had rather expansively defined

express advocacy, in a similar fashion to the proposed McCain-Finegold “election reform” bill. If allowed, this would have placed additional restrictions upon speech prior to elections. The court found the regulation “blatantly unconstitutional” and that it would kill public debate concerning significant issues. This is the third time such a regulation has been found unconstitutional by a federal court. The pro-life attorney on the case, James Bopp, stated that the decision is “overwhelming reaffirmation of the right of our citizens to engage in political speech, a right which lies at the core of our protected first amendment liberties.”

ABORTIONIST HASKELL SUED: A suit filed in Hamilton County Common Pleas Court against Martin Haskell, the late term abortionist, has come to our attention. It states that he botched an abortion he was performing on a local woman, causing her to undergo a second abortion to complete the first, and all of this without her written consent. The woman is not being named, but the monetary damages requested are substantial.

OHIO BILL TO LIMIT USE OF RU 486: Representative Tom Brinkman (R) and a bipartisan group of lawmakers have introduced a bill to place restrictions on the use of RU 486. According to the bill it can only be “given, sold, dispensed, administered, otherwise provided or prescribed by a physician who has determined in good faith and in the exercise of reasonable medical judgment that the life or physical health of the pregnant woman is in danger.” It could also be used if she has a “document that states that a psychiatrist has conducted a professional assessment of the pregnant woman’s mental or emotional condition and has determined that abortion by RU 486 is necessary.”

BECOME A PARENT? The Supreme Court of New Jersey has ruled that a New Jersey man cannot go against his ex-wife’s wishes and implant the embryos he conceived with her through invitro fertilization into another woman nor may he donate them to another couple. His former wife wanted the embryos destroyed so that she would not

“become a parent against her wishes.” This is the fourth such judicial ruling and it seems that a significant precedent has been established for future cases.

One comment is certainly in order. She did not want to “become a parent”. Correction, she already is a parent. Those tiny embryos are her children. She simply does not want them to be given a chance to develop and to be born.

RESPONSIBLE STEM CELL RESEARCH: Sen. John Ensign (R-NV) introduced the Responsible Stem Cell Research Act of 2001 (S.1349). This would allocate \$275 million of federal funding for adult stem cell research and establish a national stem cell donor bank. This development puts funding where responsible research should be and does it without violating any ethical standards.

SHAME ON U. OF DAYTON: The University of Dayton gave former U.S. Senator John Glenn its “Leadership with Virtue Award.” Glenn served for 24 years in the U.S. Senate, voting pro-abortion 120 out of 122 votes. The president of the Cardinal Newman Society, dedicated to strengthening Catholic identity in Catholic colleges, stated, “Today many Catholics are ashamed of one of our own Catholic institutions. At a time when America is under the shadow of terrorist killings of innocent people and the prospect of more violence, UD chose to honor a man partly responsible for the deaths of millions of America’s pre-born children. The shadows grow even darker in Dayton today.”

A NEW IUD: Burlex laboratories has applied to the U.S. Food and Drug Administration for approval for a new intrauterine “contraceptive” device. It is called the Mirena Levonorgestrel Intrauterine System (IUS). They are trying to change the terminology from IUD, (intrauterine device) to IUS, (intrauterine system). The reason given is that it has a coating of a synthetic progesterone hormone. It is said that this releases 20 mcg. daily into the cavity of the uterus. This then works in two ways – one way is the usual function of the mechanical IUD, the other adds a hormonal factor. How does it work? Considering the two functions, this would not prevent ovulation in many cases. Also, it may or may not hinder the transport of sperm through the uterus. One thing it will do is to prevent implantation of a one-week-old embryo in the lining of the womb. And it will do this for two reasons. One is the simple mechanical effect of this device, the other is a hormone effect. The bottom line is that this is not a contraceptive, but certainly an abortive device.

INFANTICIDE IN CANADA: Under new rules being considered by the Alberta College of Physicians and Surgeons, a doctor will be allowed to inject a fatal dose of sodium chloride into the heart of a seriously malformed unborn baby prior to birth. If born, the infant should have a “do not resuscitate” order and be left without food or fluids until death. The instruction speaks of “lethal defect”, but if such a baby is surely going to die after birth, why risk injuring the mother by such an injection when waiting for a normal delivery is the safest thing to do?

U.S. DOCTORS OPPOSE EUTHANASIA: The American College of Physicians, the United States second largest medical organization, with 90,000 members, has joined the American Medical Association in officially opposing assisted suicide. “We must solve the problems of inadequate care at the end of life, not avoid them through practices like assisted suicide... Providing more and better care for pain and suffering, treating depression more aggressively, increasing access to hospice care are all essential to helping terminally ill patients die more comfortably,” the organization stated. It further noted that assisted suicide would damage the patient-physician relationship, jeopardize the medical profession’s role of only healing, and lessen the value placed on life. It did emphasize the group’s strong support for a patient’s right to refuse treatment or to halt treatment.

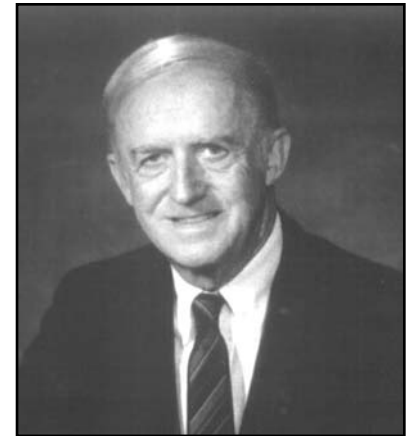
ONCOLOGISTS AND EUTHANASIA: In a study just published in the Annals of Internal Medicine, it was found that support for assisted suicide and euthanasia among physicians specializing in cancer treatment has dropped sharply. In 1994, 45% of oncologists supported physician-assisted suicide. In 1998, only 22% still supported it. How many would support the direct killing of the patient by lethal injection? In 1994, 22% said yes; in 1998, only 6%. The authors of the study stated that the change was primarily due to “expanding knowledge about how to facilitate a good death, which made euthanasia and physician-assisted suicide no longer seem necessary or desirable.”

PAS AFTER FETAL ABNORMALITY: Psychological stress has been found to be significantly higher three months later among women who terminated their pregnancies between 24 and 34 weeks, in cases of fetal abnormality than it was for women who delivered such babies after 34 weeks. (Hunfeld, et al, “Emotional Reactions in Women Late in Pregnancy Following Ultrasound Diagnosis of Severe or Lethal Fetal Malformation”, 13 Perinatal Diagnoses, 603, 609, 1993). Furthermore, evidence exists that protecting the child from abortion in such cases is better for the mother as well as the baby. Studies of psychological

complications that occur within two years of an abortion show that a disproportionate number of such complications were related to abortions for fetal abnormality. (Zolse & Blacker, “The Psychological Complications of Therapeutic Abortions” 160 Br. J. Psych. 742, 1992.)

In Memoriam - Matthew Bulfin, M.D.

Dr. Bulfin began his career as a professor of OB and GYN at Loyola University in Chicago. Moving in 1970 to Ft. Lauderdale, he became chairman of the Holy Cross Hospital and president of their medical staff. During his fruitful life, he was given many honors, but we will remember him as the founding president of the American Association of Pro-Life Obstetricians and Gynecologists. He will be missed.



F.A.C.E. LAW AGAINST ABORTIONIST: A young pregnant woman was on the operating table at the Aware Women’s Center for Choice, an abortion chamber in Florida. As the procedure began, she felt an acute abdominal pain and begged the abortionist to stop. He ordered his four assistants to hold her down and continued the abortion while she screamed for help. When it was over, she was taken to the emergency room where it was shown that he had perforated her uterus and lacerated her colon. Reparative surgery was needed and also the removal of the now dead baby. She entered a lawsuit, claiming that he had violated the Freedom of Access to Clinic Entrances Act (FACE). This had been passed by Congress to silence counselors outside of abortion chambers. Her argument, however, turned it around, and in a major setback for the abortion industry, the Eleventh Circuit Court of Appeals stated that if she had been restrained for the purpose of preventing her from obtaining any reproductive health service, then this has violated the FACE Act. This decision by a federal court of appeals has criminalized forced abortion. It can now be used to help protect women against many abortion-related abuses, including lack of informed consent.



CYTOTEC PRODUCES DEFORMITIES:

In the American Journal of Medical Genetics, 95 [2000]: (297-301.) Medical researchers have reported on infants whose mothers took Cytotec (Misoprostol) in an attempt to produce a chemical abortion. The attempt failed and the babies went

to term and were delivered. Quoting from the paper: “The most striking manifestations common to the patients were growth retardation, underdeveloped bones, short equinovarus feet, rigidity of multiple joints with skin dimples and webs, decreased movement of legs, hypoplasia or atrophy of limb muscles, and absent tendon reflexes.” In the past, other reports resultant from such exposure have noted cranial nerve deficiency, microcephalus, delayed motor & mental development, hydrocephaly & the Mobius anomaly.

A BABY PAD: A convent in Germany has revived a practice from the 15th century. It has provided a hatch through which mothers can place their unwanted newborns. On the outside is a fingerprint pad so that mothers can leave proof of their identity in case they want to reclaim their babies later. If 8 weeks pass without the mother returning, the child will be put up for adoption. Inside the hatch are a warm bed and a bell to alert the sisters in the convent who have prepared this new little welcome bed.



PROCLAMATION – PRESIDENT BUSH:

Stating that “Strong families make a strong America,” President Bush noted that teens who sit down to dinner with the family seven nights a week are 20% less likely to smoke, drink or use illegal drugs. In contrast, teens who never eat dinner with their families are 61% more likely to engage in these harmful and illegal acts. Thank you, Mr. Bush, for standing up for the family.

JESSE JACKSON’S CHILD NOT ABORTED: The mother of Reverend Jesse Jackson’s child, born out of wedlock, related an interesting aspect to this. She had breast cancer a year before becoming pregnant and did not think that she could conceive. She did. Two different doctors recommended to her that she have an abortion for fear that the pregnancy would re-ignite her breast cancer. Thinking that this was her only chance to have a child, she ignored those recommendations and gave birth to the baby. Apparently, both mother and child are doing just fine.

BLACK PRO-LIFE PROTEST: An African American pro-abortion group had planned a summit at Howard University in D.C. Hearing of this, the Reverend Johnny Hunter, director of the Life Education and Resource Network, a black pro-life group, retaliated, stating: “Where is the outrage for the 1,452 black children killed by abortion every day?” He gathered several dozen of his members from around the country and demonstrated on that campus to offer a different message to its students.

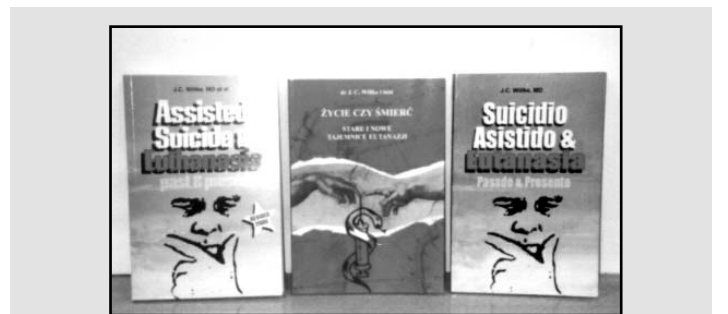


QUIT SMOKING – SAVE BABY:

Women who quit smoking during the first trimester of pregnancy could decrease the risk of stillbirth by 25% and decrease the risk of infant mortality by 20%. Karen Wisborg, et al, at Aarhus Univ. Hospital, Denmark, followed 25,000 pregnant women for seven years. Compared to women who did not smoke, the babies delivered by the smokers were twice as likely to be stillborn and twice as likely to die after birth. If an expectant mother quit during the first trimester of pregnancy, the risks decreased to those similar to women who had not smoked at all. This according to a study in The American Journal of Epidemiology, 15 August 2000, as reported by Reuters 8-17.

AMERICAN CANCER SOCIETY PRO-ABORTION:

The American Cancer Society’s National Board, recently approved a resolution “supporting pluripotent stem cell research.” This would not be upsetting if they had limited themselves to stem cells obtained from already born humans or umbilical cord blood in an ethical fashion. Apparently, they have endorsed the direct killing of living human embryos in order to obtain the stem cells that they speak of. Perhaps we should not be surprised. For years now, the American Cancer Society has engaged in a very obvious, continuous and intensive cover-up of the relationship between induced abortion and breast cancer.

STRAIGHT TALK

Even though, as I said in the previous article in this series, it can't be scientifically proved that fetuses are human beings, there is evidence that can settle the question objectively. And it is essential for us to know what that evidence is, since the issue isn't a simple or straightforward one.

For now, let's consider just what's the difference between a human corpse and a human being. Obviously, the corpse was a human being, and it has all of the human material; but it's not a human being any longer. What's missing?

The obvious difference is that it's not alive; but what does that mean? Especially since some of the parts (cells) may still be living even after the body as a whole dies.

The difference here is that the body doesn't function as a dynamic unit; the parts aren't interacting in the way they used to, in such a way that it's "really" the body as a whole that acts. That is, when Johnny is alive and hits Sally with his fist, it's Johnny who hits Sally, because what his fist does is first and foremost what he does. In a living body, the parts exist for and function for the whole; in fact, it's the body as a whole that built the parts in the first place. When the parts are no longer functioning in "cooperation" with each other, the body is dead.

So a human being, like every other living body, has a unifying energy whereby the parts act together to make the whole function as a unit.

And the major thing this unifying energy does (besides unifying the body) is maintain the body as a whole at a high energy-level. When this unifying energy is no longer acting, the parts of the body decay: that is, lose energy and organi-

zation, and go down to their "ground state" lowest possible energy-level; and, of course, each part of the body no longer acts for the benefit of the whole, as it did when the body was alive.

And the fact that this unifying energy is necessary to a body also explains why a tissue culture of living human cells is not a human being, even though each cell is alive, and each cell has the full human genetic structure. The cells in the tissue culture just "do their own thing," and divide and reproduce more skin cells, but don't form themselves into a complex organized unit, as the human body does. This shows that the human unifying energy is not present in them, and so the mass is not a human being.

Notice, however, that each cell is alive, and its parts function together for the good of the cell—and yet that doesn't make each cell a human being. So being alive and having the human genetic structure is not a sufficient condition for being a human being, though it's a necessary one. So we have a way to go before we find out what makes a body a human being.

But even at this point, we can answer some questions. For instance, when a woman says she has a right to do what she wants with her own body, does that include her fetus? Is the fetus in fact a part of the mother's body?

But that's for the next article.

On Friday and Saturday, Dr. Reardon noted that the majority of women who choose abortion do so because they feel they have no other choice. They need to know that God forgives them and that we do, too. He stated that the reality of abortion for a woman is twofold - it destroys her baby and exposes her to a wide range of physical, emotional and spiritual risks and complications. Dr. Reardon predicted abortion will become unthinkable when the truth that abortion hurts women is understood.

THE WHY REPORT

comments & info for generation next

For some time now, I've been on the Planned Parenthood mailing list. Unfortunately, "Pro-Choice" campaign donation solicitations began to creep into my mailbox, out of the blue, almost a year ago. Surprised and appalled, I spotted their logo on an envelope in my stack of bills and marveled at how on earth my address got into their hands. But before I could toss their letter into the wastebasket, I felt as if God had grinned slightly at this obvious mistake on their part. He knew it would provide me countless revelations into the depth and breadth of what I believe is the world's most successful lie: That the conceived unborn are not human, valuable, or accounted for. Worse, they are unwanted invaders. They are killed for a perceived affront on women's bodies.

Planned Parenthood's recent mailer, as I re-read it today, eerily mirrors the tragedies in America of September 11. Newsstand-like headlines pop off the page in declaration that the authors are "in a war against violence." Transcribed sound bites recant stories of religious fanatics who've violently, sometimes fatally attacked clinic workers while ransacking their buildings. Paragraphs later, matter-of-fact statements are

made regarding the sad reality that even this newsletter, had it been received by their offices, would be carefully scrutinized by authorities before being opened due to the rash of mail bombs they've received. "Darn it!" I thought out loud. "They're right!" On this issue alone, they have a point. We have not provided them our best example of holy warfare—especially when we consider the sensitive and fragile lives at stake. It's true. We've blown it.

There is no question that the unborn are worth fighting for. They have no voice, and are victims of the very individuals whom God in His sovereignty has appointed to nurture, love, and protect them. But the pro-life message of hope and help hasn't been clearly delivered to the so-called pro-choice community. We are all responsible for that. Anger on the part of a few people prompted violence on their part and wrongly took punishment out of God's hands. Our hatred of the sin of murder has prompted abhorrence of the murderer and their accomplices, forfeiting opportunities of redemptive revelation on a broader scale through relationship and grace. Our religiousness often shams and rejects those we judge immoral and evil, while it is possible these people

are simply ignorant of the truth. We often fail to understand that this war between the "life" and the "choice" in its basic components is equal parts spiritual and intellectual.

The proponents of Planned Parenthood appear to be professional, academic, and to the unenlightened person, logical. Regardless of our past rules of engagement, our battle tactics must now be peaceful governmental intervention through legislation and accountability, organized educational networks, and intelligent utilization of the media. Thankfully, this is where we're headed.
